What are the admission requirements?

To be eligible for admission, you must meet certain academic qualifications, dependant on what you plan to pursue at VCSU. The following provides the admission requirements for each type of student that applies to VCSU.

FRESHMAN – You are a student who has not attended college after graduating from high school or obtaining your General Education Development (GED) diploma. To be eligible for admission, you must have the following*:

- 4 units of English
- 3 units of Mathematics, Algebra I and above
- 3 units of Lab Science, including at least on unit each in two or more of the following: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Physical Science
- 3 units of Social Studies, excluding Consumer Education, Cooperative Marketing, orientation to Social Science, and Marriage/Family.

*A limited number of students who have not met the requirements above may be admitted. Contact Enrollment Services for further information.

TRANSFER – You have attended another college or university since graduating from high school or obtaining your GED. To be eligible for admission, you must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00. If you have less than 24 transferable credits, you must also meet the criteria listed for freshman applicants.

RETURNING STUDENT – You attended VCSU and have been away for one semester or more and are returning to take additional courses. If you have attended any other institutions since attending VCSU, you must have a 2.00 or greater GPA to be re-admitted.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING – You plan to take courses but do not intend to get a degree from VCSU. Be aware that you are unable to qualify for Federal Financial Aid. Beyond having a high school diploma or equivalency, there are no academic requirements for admission as a non-degree student. However, a limit of 16 credits may be taken as a non-degree student, at which time you must change your status to degree-seeking and meet applicable admission requirements.

JUMP START – You are in high school and would like to take VCSU courses. A minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.25 is required. You must also be on track to fulfilling the core course requirements outlined in the freshman section above. Parental and school official approval is verified on the required Early Entry Registration Form.

ONLINE – You plan to take all of your courses online. Follow the applicable admission standards above.

DETAILS OF OTHER REQUIREMENTS TO NOTE:

Immunization - All students taking courses on campus are required to provide verification of measles immunization. Such immunity shall be proved by:

- presenting evidence of two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine no less than one month apart,
- presenting proof of a positive serologic test for measles,
- presenting proof of date of birth prior to 1957.

*Exemptions to this policy may be granted for medical reasons (certified by a licensed physician) or religious objections (form available from the Enrollment Services Office). This requirement applies to all students. No student will be officially admitted without the report on file with the Enrollment Services Office.

Canadian Applicants – Along with the applicable admission requirements listed above, you must also provide proof of financial support for your study in the United States by completing the International Student Financial Statement available at www.vcsu.edu/international. A non-refundable \$100 tuition deposit is also required.

International Applicants (other than Canadian) – Because of additional information needed as part of immigration requirements, complete the international application located in pdf form at www.vcsu.edu/international.

FOOD SERVICE (Board Plans)

We have the most flexible meal plans available in the region. You only pay when you eat, which means that you don't lose your money if you miss a meal or two. The following are the meal plans available for your choice.

Board Plan 1: This plan is designed for light eaters as well as students who frequently go home on weekends.

Board Plan 2: This plan will meet the needs of students who spend some weekends away from campus and eat an average of two meals each day and seldom snack.

Board Plan 3: This plan is our most popular plan with students who eat an average of three meals per day.

Board Plan 4: This is an Extra Bonus Plan that is designed for those who eat all meals on a regular basis, snack frequently, and remain on campus most weekends.

GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE BOARD CONTRACT PROGRAM

- A. Students pay for their board contract at the VCSU Business Office. Students will be issued an identification card and must present the ID card for payment of purchases made in either the cafeteria or “Viking I” snack bar. Lost or stolen ID cards should be reported to the Student Center Information Desk immediately. Illegal or fraudulent use of the ID card will result in the appropriate disciplinary action.
- B. Students requesting board contract plan changes for a subsequent semester must complete the necessary form with the Housing Office, located in the Student Center, prior to the end of the semester.
- C. The board contract does not include regular University vacations such as Veteran’s Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, President’s Day, semester breaks, Easter, and other days designated as national or state holidays. The board contract begins with the first day of classes and ends on the last day of final examinations for that semester. Any changes in the normal board contract schedule will be posted at the entrance to the cafeteria.
- D. In the event that food service credit remains at the end of the semester, refunds will not be given or applied to the next semester. Refunds for students who cancel enrollment will follow the regular University refund policy. The University refund/repayment policy is available at www.vcsu.edu/financialaid or the Financial Aid Office.
- E. Any questions regarding the board contract program should be referred to the Food Service Director.
- F. University facility charge a constant charge paid to VCSU for utilities, equipment, depreciation, etc. For detailed information regarding this charge, refer to the Food Service brochure.

GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE RESIDENCE HALL ROOM CONTRACT

- A. If an occupant vacates a double room, the remaining occupant will have the option of paying the single rate (providing the room is not needed by the Housing Office) or being assigned to an occupied room.
 - 1. Single rooms are assigned on the basis of prioritized availability.
 - 2. The University reserves the right to transfer students from one room and/or hall to another if deemed necessary either prior to the opening of the University semester or during the year.
 - 3. The University reserves the right to enter rooms to aid in our basic responsibility regarding maintenance, student conduct, and in our role as an educational institution. A complete description of the Room Entry policy can be found in the Residence Hall Handbook.
- B. The University is not responsible for the personal belongings of any resident at any time. If these items are not covered by your family’s present homeowners policy; it is suggested that personal property insurance be obtained if expensive items are to be kept in your room.
- C. Personal refrigerators up to 4.5 cubic feet are allowed in the residence halls. Waterbeds are not permitted in the residence halls.
- D. Pets are not allowed in the residence halls.
- E. **The residence halls will be closed during extended vacation periods** i.e., Christmas/Semester Break and Spring Break. A special charge will be made for those who must stay. Approved arrangements must be made seven days in advance with the housing office. The Housing Office reserves the right to move students to another residence hall during the break period.
- F. Any damage beyond normal wear or loss of furniture or equipment will be charged against the responsible person or persons. We expect a certain amount of wear to occur to your room, however, you will be charged for damage or loss which is a result of negligence or misconduct. Damage within your room will be the joint responsibility of the residents assigned to the room, unless individual responsibility is determined. Any damage to the public areas in the residence halls, i.e., lounge, restrooms, hallways, elevators, stairwells, lighting units, fire extinguishers, etc., will be charged to the individual(s) responsible for the damage. If the party responsible is not determined or reported, the charges will be assessed to each resident of the floor or the entire residence hall, whichever is appropriate.
- G. Residence Hall Cancellations/Withdrawal: Students will be billed for the residence hall room until all personal property is removed and has properly checked out, even if he/she has ceased attending classes or withdrawn from school. Students leaving as a result of academic suspension, disciplinary sanctions, or withdrawal must check out of the residence hall within 24 hours from the date notified. The Housing Department reserves the right to remove items left in rooms beyond that time and to sell or dispose of any property held in storage for one year or more.
- H. By signing this contract the student agrees to abide by the rules and regulations outlined in the VCSU Residence Hall Life Handbook and the VCSU Student Code of Conduct, listed in the Student Handbook.
