Who is a CLOSE CONTACT?

Being within 6 feet of a COVID-19 case for a prolonged period of time (greater than 10 minutes). A close contact would also be someone who was directly coughed or sneezed on or an individual who was not wearing appropriate personal protective equipment.

How do I know if I am a CLOSE CONTACT?

The NDDoH conducts interviews with all persons diagnosed with COVID-19 to determine who are their close contacts. People who are identified as close contacts will be notified by the NDDoH and will receive instruction on quarantine and monitoring.

**Being in an indoor environment (e.g., store, workplace, restaurant) with someone who has COVID-19 is not necessarily considered having close contact.*
