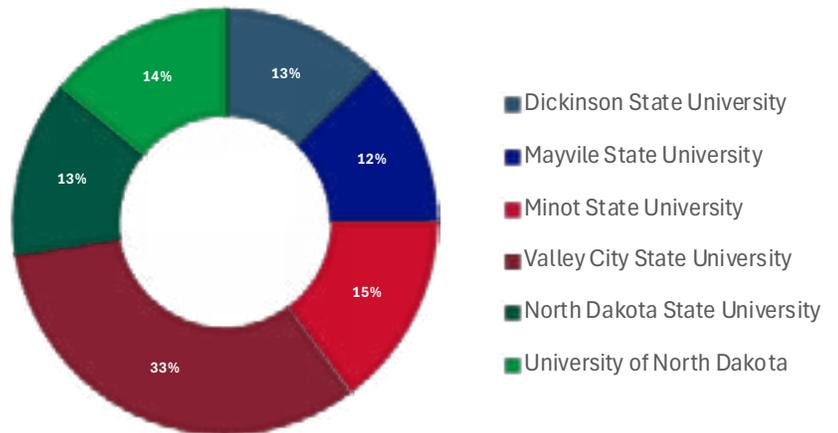
STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

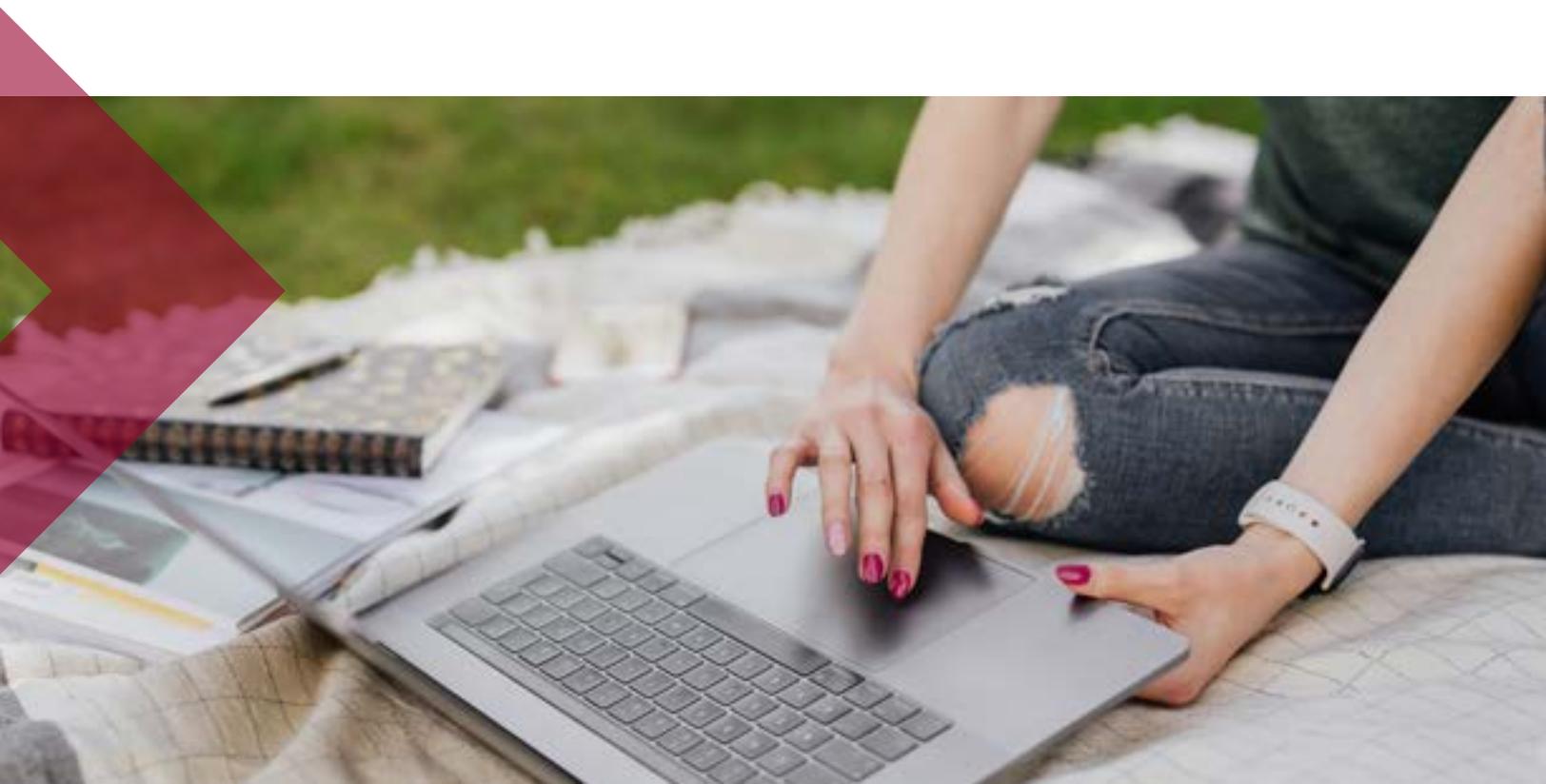
