Campus Hazing Transparency Report

Purpose

Pursuant to Section 485(f) of the Higher Education Act, as amended by the Stop Campus Hazing Act, Valley City State University (VCSU) publishes this Campus Hazing Transparency Report to summarize findings concerning student organizations found responsible for violations of University standards of conduct related to hazing.

This report is maintained in a prominent location on the University's website and is updated at least twice each year. Information is provided in accordance with federal requirements and does not include personally identifiable information about individual students.

Definition of Hazing

Valley City State University prohibits hazing on the part of individuals and campus organizations. Hazing is an act that endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student, results in the destruction or removal of public or private property, or causes physical or psychological discomfort, embarrassment, or humiliation for the purpose of initiation or admission into, affiliation with, confirming any form of affiliation with, or continued membership in a student organization, regardless of a student's willingness to participate in the activity.

Reporting Hazing

All members of the VCSU community who have been subjected to, witnessed, or become aware of suspected hazing have the right to make a report to VCSU, local law enforcement, and/or state law enforcement, or to choose not to report.

- Resident Life (Resident Hall Directors, Resident Assistants, Apartment Managers)
- Title IX Coordinator
- Deputy Title IX Coordinator
- Head Coaches and Assistant Coaches
- Director of Sports Medicine/Associate Athletic Director
- Director for the Student Center/Student Activities
- Staff Supervisors of Student Workers

- Student Organization Advisors
- Local Law Enforcement
